GAME HIGHLIGHTS

Pre-Season

- Stevie Hernandez of the Majors Cardinals hit his first home run of the season against the Phillies on February 22.
- On February 28, Hudson Turner of the Majors Orioles hit his first home run on the season. The dinger came against the Phillies.
- Stevie Hernandez (Majors Cardinals) hit his second home run of the season on March 1. The hit came in his first at bat against the Mariners.

Regular Season

- On March 10, Stevie Hernandez of the Majors Cardinals hit his third home run of the season in the top of the fifth inning against the Phillies.
- With two outs in the bottom of the sixth inning on March 11, Thompson Zimmerman hit a clutch solo homerun to center field to tie the game for the Majors Braves and send it into extra innings.
- On March 15, CJ Heth of the Majors Cardinals hit his first Little League home run of his career against the A's in the top of the third inning to tie the game at 4. The ball easily cleared the blue fence in left field.
- Wolf Orell of the Tee Ball Mets hit a walk off grand slam deep over right center to end the Tee Ball Mets vs Rockies on March 15. He did it in front of a packed crowd that included his parents, sister, grandma, aunts, uncle and cousins.
- On March 15, Grayson Pezeshkan of the Majors Diamondbacks hit 3 Home Runs against the Astros, including a 3 run HR and 2 grand slams. Grayson went 3/3 at the plate, 3 home runs, 2 grand slams, and a 3-run homer for a total of 11 RBIs, driving in all 11 runs for the Diamondbacks.
 - He hit a 3-run homer in the bottom of the first to give the Diamondbacks the lead, 3-2. The ball hit off the top of the scoreboard, pinged off the flagpole and back onto the field.
 - o In his second at bat, he hit his second HR and first grand slam of the game in a shot over the right field wall, bringing Diamondbacks to the lead, 7-5.
 - o In his last at bat, he hit yet another grand slam, this time over the center field, regaining the lead again, 11-9.
- On Saturday, March 15th, Branden Arcienega of the Majors Astros hit a towering fly ball over the Blue Monster on AAA. This was Branden's first Little League homerun, and the first homerun by an 11-year-old this year.
- On March 19, Jake Lucas of the Majors Orioles hit a legit LASER over the Major's Field LF fence into soccer field.
- On Friday, March 21, Nate LaFleur of the Majors Phillies hit a solo shot over the left field fence against the Giants.

- On March 22, in the first inning of a battle against the Coach Pitch Cardinals, Wilder Sinclair of the Coach Pitch Marlins hit a mammoth fly ball over the left center field fence and into the 4-pack batting cages for his first home run of the season.
- On March 22, Lucas Lefler of the Tee Ball Pirates hit a monster smash to right center that cleared the foul pole on the adjacent field.
- On March 22, Charlie Dragicevich of the Majors Athletics hit a 2-run home run deep over the right field fence against the Reds. The monster shot was on the first pitch of the at-bat to give the A's a 3-0 lead.
- Later on in the same Athletics-Reds game, DJ Moraleja of the Majors Athletics drove a 1-0 pitch over the left center field fence for a 2-run home run. The home run extended the team's lead to 5-2.
- On March 22, Jake Negron of the Majors Diamondbacks hit a monstrous solo home run against the Phillies, a deep fly ball over the center/left center wall for the go ahead run. Jake has hit it out in travel but this was his first home un in Little League.
- On March 24, Zachary Barnum of the Majors Orioles hit his first home run of the season, a MAJESTIC fly to left center on the Majors field against the Majors Braves. A great hit by a great kid.
- On March 28, DJ Moralega of the Majors Athletics crushed a solo HR deep over the right field fence in the bottom of the first inning. It was DJs second homerun of the season.
- On March 29, Cyrus Loordgooei of the Coach Pitch Pirates hit a deep fly to left off the top of the fence and over for a Home Run!
- DJ Moralega of the Majors Athletics hit the first pitch he saw in the top of the first inning on March 29 over the centerfield fence to put the A's on top 2-0. It was DJ's third homerun of the season.
- On March 29, Santino Gualajara of the Tee Ball A's hit the first home run of the season for his team.
- On March 29, Walker Mishlof of the Tee Ball Reds led off hitting for his team with a home run over the center field fence. In his second at bat, he hit the fence and almost had back to back homers. This was special for Walker facing his classmates and friends on the White Sox.
- On April 4, in the bottom of the second inning against the Majors Diamondbacks, Steveie Hernandez blasted his fourth home run of the season to center field to give the Majors Cardinals a 4-3 lead.
- On April 5, Rhys Rutherford of the Tee Ball Cardinals smashed a line drive over the centerfield wall.
- On April 9, Hudson Turner destroyed a line drive about 217 feet to left center at the Majors Field.
- On April 10, in the top of the third inning against the Majors Giants, Stevie Hernandez his a three-run shot to right center field on the Majors Field to open the scoring and give the Cardinals a 3-0 lead.
- On April 12, Myles Carter of the Coach Pitch Yankees crushed a towering home run that soared high into the sky and way over the fence. The crack of the bat told the whole story: No doubt, no chance the ball was staying in the park, just pure power.

- On April 12, Hudson Turner of the Majors Orioles hit his third homerun of the season. It was an oppo bomb to lead off the game against the Cardinals.

- In the bottom of the second inning on April 19, C.J. Heth hit a two-run homerun to left field on the Majors field to push the Cardinals lead to 6-2. It was C.J.'s second home run of the season.
- On April 19, Jake Negron hit a two-run home run against the Astros in the top of the first inning with a deep fly to left field on a pitch high and outside.
- On a 3-2 count in the game on April 19th, Nate Askew of the Majors White Sox crushed a fastball over the left field fence for a three-run homer and was mobbed by his teammates in celebration.
- On April 19, Zayne Parvis of the Coach Pitch Diamondbacks hit his first home run of the season against the Braves.
- On April 23, in the top of the sixth inning against the Majors Diamondbacks Stevie Herandez hit a line drive two-run home run on the Majors field to extend the Cardinals' lead to 10-4. It was Stevie's league-leading 7th home run of the season.
- On April 26 in the first game against the Giants, second inning, Wilder Sinclair of the Coach Pitch Marlins hit his second home run of the season, soaring an unbelievable 15 to 20 feet over the center field fence!
- On April 29, Grayson Pezeshkan of the Majors Diamondbacks hit a 2-run home run on the Majors field. It was a fly ball to center field.
- In the top of the first inning against the Majors White Sox on May 1, Majors Cardinals Stevie Hernandez hit a lead-off home run to right field on the Majors field to make the game 1-0. It was Stevie's eighth home run of the season.
- On May 3, Theo Muehlen of the Coach Pitch Pirates launched a shot over the centerfield wall against the Coach Pitch Giants.
- On May 3, Prescott Sullivan of the Coach Pitch Cardinals fouled off one pitch, stayed ready in the box and got ahead of the next pitch, absolutely crushing it over the center field wall. The ball looked like it was still on its way up after it cleared the fence by a good 10-15 feet!

- On May 3, Sebastian Stevens of the AA Mariners clobbered a first pitch fastball and hit it out of the AA park to the left field. This was the first home run of the AA season!
- On May 3, Santino Gualajara of the Tee Ball A's hit TWO home runs in one game!
- On May 3, Thompson Zimmerman of the Majors Braves hit a three run blast to leftfield against the Diamondbacks.
- On May 9, in the bottom of the seventh inning against the Majors Mariners, Stevie Hernandez hit a two-out walk-off home run over the Blue Monster of the AAA field to help the Cardinals win their first playoff game 5-4 in extra innings. It was Stevie's ninth home run of the season and first walk-off home run.
- On May 9, Wilder Sinclair of the Coach Pitch Marlins launched a towering fly ball over the centerfield monster and on to the AA field. This is his third smashing home run of the season.
- On May 9, Casey Clayman of the Coach Pitch Marlins smashed a high drive over the left centerfield fence landing in the 4-pack batting cages. The bomb was Casey's first home run of the season.
- On May 10, Myles Carter of the Coach Pitch Yankees delivered an unforgettable performance at the plate, launching two towering home runs that left fans and fielders alike in awe.
